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Headteacher's forward

Dear Parent

In a year of greater challenge at both A-level and GCSE we are delighted with the exceptionally strong performance of our girls. We are also pleased to achieve such a consistently high level of attainment for our girls at this important milestone.

With a clean sweep of A*s in Biology, Chemistry and Physics IGCSE, 100% passes in English Literature and Mathematics and 83% of Modern Language grades at A* or A, our girls have a lot to be proud of. 95% of girls scored A* - B in Religious Studies - a remarkable achievement in a core subject taught to all girls without setting, and a testament to the skill and commitment of our RE department. Overall, girls scored A* - B in 12 subjects with over half of all pupils obtaining at least 5 A* or A grades or equivalent (9/8/7) between them. 54% of the grades achieved in Mathematics, English and English Literature combined were 9, 8 or 7 (A* - A). 95% of all pupils achieved at least 1 grade A*/A or equivalent. 82% of all results were A* - B (or equivalent 9-6). The most common grade was A* or equivalent 9/8 at GCSE this year.

For each of our GCSE pupils, this year's results represent a huge amount of dedication and ambition. We look forward to seeing their progress as they join Priory 6 for their A level courses with us.

We are also delighted that 100% of the Year 11 Additional Mathematics students achieved the top grade (A) - a great credit to them and the Mathematics department. This qualification goes beyond GCSE and serves as an introduction to AS level.

41% of A Level grades were A* or A, 72% of grades were A* to B and 92% are A* to C grades – all up from last year. 83% of girls scored A* - B in Religious Studies. In a range of subjects including Art, Business, Classics, Drama and Photography, girls scored only A* to B grades. Further highlights include Business achieving all A* and A, and two thirds of History candidates achieving A*.

Girls have gone on to study a range of preferred courses at top calibre universities, such as History at York, Biochemistry at Birmingham, Sociology at Bristol and Physics with Astronomy at Surrey. Three girls are at Leeds reading Management, Biology, and Zoology. Four girls are at Loughborough, now a top ten university.

I would especially like to thank my colleagues for their superb teaching and continuing the St Augustine's Priory culture of challenging girls to reach their potential.

I hope these excellent results, once again, will reaffirm the belief of our whole community in what we are able to achieve for our girls.
