

## 16b Risky areas

Certain areas of the school buildings and grounds are out of bounds to pupils because of the risk of entering them.

Outside such areas are generally fenced and signed appropriately. Inside rooms are kept locked when unattended by an adult.

Examples include the following. The list is not exhaustive:

- Cellar
- Roof spaces and voids
- Roofs
- Boiler and plant rooms
- Electrical cabinets and cupboards
- Kitchens
- Health centre
- Sheds
- Ponds
- Science block chemical store rooms and cupboards

It should be noted that vehicular movement is to be kept as separate as possible from people. Pupils when on foot and other pedestrians are not to use the Convent Door or the vehicle entrance and exit gates.

A new area of risk has been created behind the new Rosewood Portacabins which is out of sight of the main school. Duty staff are aware that they must be vigilant in this area.

There are separate risk assessments for certain risky areas such as the car park, the forest school and the prep playground.
